Adventure Report

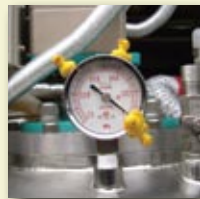
Biodiesel Adventure Team arrived in Washington DC, the final destination of the North American continent on April 19th, 2008.

They attended Earth Day events with local supporters and visited schools until the 22nd, then spent another 2 days for vehicle maintenance. On the 25th, the

vehicle was handed over to the shipping company. At this point, the phase-I trip was completed.
